A departure tax stamp of 30 dinars (equivalent to 11 Pound Sterling/13 Euros) now has to be purchased by each tourist visiting Tunisia.

The stamp can be purchased from any airport, port, local revenue office or border checkpoint in Tunisia. It can be purchased at any time during a stay in the country.

The tax stamp is affixed to the passport and retained by the authorities on departure.

Melbourne is World's Most Liveable City

Melbourne has been named the best city in the world to live in for the fourth year running in the Economist Intelligence Unit's (EIU) Global Liveability Index.

The EIU's *Liveability Ranking* measures living conditions in 140 countries across five overarching criteria of stability, healthcare, culture and environment, education and infrastructure.

Melbourne achieved perfect scores of 100 on healthcare, education and infrastructure and a perfect 100 in the sub-category of sport.

The report reveals that, since 2009 average 'liveability' across the world has fallen by 0.7%, led by a 1.3% fall in the score for stability and safety, with over 50 of the cities surveyed have seen declines in liveability over the last five years.

Recent conflicts in Ukraine and the Middle East have underlined continuing fallout from a decade of destabilising events ranging from the war in Iraq to the Palestinian Intifada and the Arab Spring.

Cancun Tourist Board cancels Dolphin tours

A row sparked by a travel bloggers' convention, in Cancun Mexico, which was offering dolphin tours to its delegates has ended with a tourist board cancelling the tours.

The TBEX convention, taking place in Cancun, Mexico, in September, offered delegates the chance to take part in dolphin activities offered by the local tourist board.

However, some of its members complained about the activities, saying that TBEX shouldn't be offering captive-dolphin activities because they were cruel.

Wildlife charity Care for the Wild, which runs the RIGHT-tourism.org campaign on animal tourism, also got involved and, as a result, the Cancun Tourist Board has cancelled the tours as part of the TBEX convention.

Care for the Wild believe that keeping dolphins captive for people's entertainment is no longer something that should be blindly accepted.
