The Aranui 5

The Aranui 5, currently being built will be making its maiden voyage from Tahiti to the Marquesas Islands in the South Pacific Ocean in November 2015.

To celebrate its launch the Aranui 5 will be offering a ten per cent discount on the first five 14-day departures of 2016 booked by 31 August 2015.

The cargo ship dubbed 'The Freighter to Paradise' is a lifeline transporting goods to the remote islanders of Papeete, Takapoto amd Rangiroa in the Tuamotu Archipelago and Bora Bora on the Society Islands.

UK visitors take 60 million trips abroad every year

New analysis by Centtrip1, which offers the first prepaid MasterCard with 14 currencies on a single card at 'spread free' exchange rates, reveals that UK citizens took over 60 million trips abroad in 2014, an increase of 8.1% (4.5 million trips) on 2010.

The key findings show:

- Spain is number one overseas destination
- Romania sees 113% increase in the number of visits from UK residents over the past five years
- Finland was second with an increase of 87% while Lithuania, Russia and Morocco saw increases of 76%, 51% and 49% respectively.

London's Southbank Centre is the UK's largest arts centre, comprising the Royal Festival Hall, Queen Elizabeth Hall and Hayward Gallery) and occupying a 21-acre site that sits in the midst of London's most vibrant cultural quarter on the South Bank of the Thames.

The site has history stretching back to the 1951 Festival of Britain and offers an extensive artistic and cultural programme including annual and one-off themed festivals and classical and contemporary music, performance, dance, visual art and literature and spoken word events throughout the year.

Southbank Festival of Love

Southbank Centre has opened its second summer-long *Festival of Love*, featuring a wideranging programme of performances, music, differently-themed weekends, exhibitions and installations across the site.

This year's festival takes its inspiration from Nelson Mandela, the South African leader who died in 2013, and his 67 years of campaigning for civil rights - 40 years as a campaigner and 27 as a prisoner.

Throughout the Festival of Love, the site will showcase more than 20 love-themed installations and exhibitions.

Themed weekends

Themed weekends include:

- the Mandela Weekend (18 19 July)
- the Urban Weekend (8 9 August), celebrating street culture such as parkour, street art, BMXing and music
- Refugee Week (18 21 June), which will highlight the contribution of refugees to the UK with music and art; and
- the return of the Big Wedding Weekend (29 – 30 August), the climax to the Festival of Love.

The Big Wedding Weekend

Launched last summer, Southbank Centre created the *Big Wedding Weekend* to celebrate the change in law in England and Wales enabling everyone to marry their partner of choice.

To date, 40 couples have signed up to take part and couples interested in joining them have until 28th July to register for this very different and affordable take on getting married.

South bank Centre is able to welcome up to 100 couples to wed, renew their vows or convert their civil partnership into marriage in a number of communal ceremonies.

There will be up to 20 couples each ceremony across the two days in the Royal Festival Hall, in front of their guests.

The mass ceremonies will be followed by an option for all couples and their parties to eat together at a large wedding breakfast, before the celebratory evening entertainment on *The Clore Ballroom* begins.





Other Festival of Love programme highlights include:

The pop-up theatre Roundabout (7 June – 18 July) by Paines Plough – named Theatre Building of the Year at The Stage Awards 2015.

The theatre is hosting a number of shows including:

- Every Brilliant Thing, about depression and the lengths people go to for those they love (7 – 11 July), and
- Lungs by Duncan Macmillan, which explores different types of love when a couple want a child but are running out of time in an age of global anxiety, erratic weather and political unrest.
- Garsington Opera and the Royal Shakespeare Company presenting their first-ever collaboration, a production of A Midsummer Night's Dream, over three nights (22 – 24 July)
- Baz Luhrmann's Romeo and Juliet brought to life by 200-voice indie choir Some Voices, b-boys and actors in an immersive theatre experience (11 July)

- Folk with Altitude (22 July 29 August), a new season of exclusive gigs on the Queen Elizabeth Hall Roof Garden, presented with Nest Collective, and
- Baila Brazil by Bale de Rua, a show inspired by South-American street dance, capoeira and samba, comprising 13 male dancers, one female dancer, a singer and a band, many of whom grew up in the favelas of Brazil (5 – 15 August).

Free artist-led activities

Free artist-led activities, including craft, poetry and dance workshops, will take place every day throughout the festival from 11am – 4pm in Royal Festival Hall.

Festival of Love food pop-ups on site this summer (until 27 September) include Bleeker St. Burger, featured in TimeOut as one of the top 10 street food stalls in London and SNOG serving frozen yoghurt from a restored pink 1967 Routemaster bus.
