News

London the world's most visited city

London is the world's most popular travel destination, according to the annual MasterCard Global Destinations Cities Index.

Britain's capital will welcome 18.82million international overnight visitors who will spend a total of £13.3billion (\$20.23billion) in 2015, the research shows.

The index puts London in pole position for the fifth time in seven years with the Thai capital Bangkok and the French capital Paris into second and third respectively.

Dubai is ranked fourth, followed by Istanbul, whose rapid rise in visitors knocks New York out of the top five this year.

The Global Destinations Cities Index provides a ranking of the 132 most visited cities around the world and delivers deeper understanding of how people move around the world.

The world's top 10 cities, ranked by overnight visitor numbers are:

London – 18.82 million
 Bangkok – 18.24 million
 Paris – 16.06 million visitors
 Dubai – 14.26 million visitors
 Istanbul – 12.56 million visitors
 New York – 12.27 million visitors
 Singapore – 11.88 million visitors
 Kuala Lumpur – 11.12 million visitors
 Seoul – 10.35 million visitors
 Hong Kong – 8.66 million visitors

In 2015, international travellers will make 382.9million visits by air to the world's top 132 cities, collectively spending £236billion (\$360billion).

The report predicts a 6% rise in international overnight visitors to London in 2015 and a 2.3% increase in spending, compared to last year.

This underlines London's dominance as a global hub for international business and tourism and a gateway to the rest of the country.

Across the globe, a few key trends stand out, including:

Asia/Pacific – The region is home to three of the top four fastest-growing destination cities between 2009 and 2015 – Colombo, Chengdu and Osaka.

Europe – Istanbul is the most diversified destination, with 50 percent of its international overnight visitors coming from 33 feeder cites.

Latin America – Lima is both the top destination and the fastest growing city in the region, featuring almost 50 percent more international overnight visitors than second-ranked Mexico City.

Middle East and Africa – Dubai continues to be one of the fastest growing cities in the global top ten while Abu Dhabi is the third fastest growing destination city overall between 2009 and 2015.

North America – Houston is the fastest growing in North America since 2009 and is the only destination city in North America with double-digit growth.

The MasterCard Global Destination Cities Index

The MasterCard Index of Global Destination Cities ranks cities in terms of the number of their total international overnight visitor arrivals and the cross-border spending by these same visitors in the destination cities, and gives visitor and passenger growth forecasts for 2015.

Shakespeare's England, UK

Shakespeare's England, the tourism organisation for Stratford-upon-Avon, Warwick, Kenilworth, Royal Learnington Spa and surrounding areas, has produced its destination management plan.

The tourism plan outlines the shared statement of intent of how the industry, local authorities and the Coventry and Warwickshire Local Enterprise Partnership can develop the area as a visitor destination over the next decade.

Latest figures underline the importance of tourism to the local economy and indicate that from 2012 to 2013, the tourism spend in the Shakespeare's England area rose by 15% to £631 million per annum, employing over 11,000 people.

The campaign, which will launch this summer, will include outdoor, radio, and digital advertising in the UK, Germany and North America.

Press trips and PR activity will focus on core markets in the UK, France, Netherlands, Germany, Sweden, North America, Canada, Australia and New Zealand.

Key themes used within the campaign will be 'soft adventure' (cycling, walking, mountain biking), food and drink, events, mining, textiles and literature.

The latest statistics from the World Travel and Tourism Council (WTTC) report, place the Sultanate at 9th out of 141 countries worldwide under the security and safety criteria.

Carsten Höller: Decision, the Hayward Gallery, Southbank Centre, London to 6 September 2015

This major exhibition at Hayward Gallery presents a wide range of Höller's works and bring together sculptures, videos, installations and light works that are designed to profoundly re-orientate awareness of time and space.

Decision involves its visitors in a series of experimental environments, reflecting Höller's wide-ranging interest in the nature of consciousness.

- **Pill Clock** (2011-15), a ceiling-mounted timepiece will drop over one million pills onto the gallery floor during the course of the exhibition.
- Flying Mushrooms (2015), is a new large-scale work of an upside-down mobile with giant psychedelic mushrooms
- **Moving Beds** (2015), a pair of robotic beds that restlessly roam the galleries like 'insomniac twins'

Operation Redsand Forts, the Thames Estuary UK

The Redsand Forts were built in 1942 for anti-aircraft defence off the Essex coast in the Thames Estuary,

There are seven forts, originally with interconnected steel platforms, of which six forts had mounted guns arranged in a semicircle around the control centre with one being used as a searchlight tower.

During WW2 the forts guns shot down many aircraft and flying bombs. In the late 1950s the MoD decommissioned the site.

In the 1960s various forts were re-occupied and used as pirate radio stations. Since then the Forts have been unused and lying idle.

At the end of 2014 David Marriot Cooper was asked by Project Redsand Trust to try to help do something to make use of the Forts, instead of letting them slowly deteriorate and Operation Redsand Forts was set up.

The resulting proposal is for the forts to be restored and preserved as a hotel, leisure and museum complex with catamaran and helicopter access.

While this is coming to fruition, an X-Pilot tug boat leaves from Queenborough Isle of Sheppey every weekend at 10.30am and takes visitors on a four hour trip to the Forts sailing in and out of the Forts for 30 minutes before returning.

Birding in the lakes of Champagne, France

France's wine region is encouraging visitors to head to its great lakes in the centre of the region to observe spectacular displays of birds and to enjoy outdoor activities.

Common Cranes, Greylag Geese, White Fronted and Bean Geese, White Tailed Eagles, Whooper and Bewick's Swans, Goldeneyes and many other species of migrating birds can be spotted here.

The Common Crane stops off in tens of thousands in Champagne. These elegant birds come in to rest at the great lakes en route from their nesting grounds in Scandinavia to overwinter in the warmer climes of Spain.

In Autumn and early Spring, the sight, sound and sheer quantity of cranes leaving and arriving here is spectacular.

The largest of the Champagne lakes is the Lac du Der with 4800 ha of water and 77 km of shoreline.



Over 300 species of bird

In the Der area, there are over 300 species of bird (many rare and endangered), 40 species of mammals, 45 varieties of dragonflies, 20 kinds of amphibians and more than 200 different plants.

Lac du Der has been listed as a wildlife reserve since 1978, and is one of the most important sites in France for birdwatching.






A focus on : The Regent's Park Open Air Theatre, London UK
