Liberation Route Europe, Holland

Liberation Route Europe has been established to enable visitors to get an insight into the actions in the east of North Brabant, around Arnhem, Nijmegen and the Veluwe in 1944 and 1945.

These areas were key in the final stages of the Second World War - in Operation Market Garden and the Rhineland Offensive.

The route takes in 95 audio spots, each marked by a large boulder and each with its own interesting and often moving story about the civilians and soldiers who lived and fought there in 1944-45.

Operation Market Garden

In September 1944, in an attempt to end the war before Christmas, the Allies launched Operation Market Garden.

This was the code name for an enormous allied offensive that consisted of large-scale airborne landings (Market) and an infantry advance from Belgium, through North Brabant towards the Maas, Waal and Lower Rhine rivers (Garden).

British, Polish and American airborne troops were ordered to take the bridges over these three Dutch rivers. The ground forces were charged with the quick advance towards Lake IJssel in the north.

The aim was to cut off the German troops in the west of Holland so that the Allies could make their advance into the Ruhrgebied, the industrial heart of Germany, and on to Berlin.

Despite the fact that this was one of the largest airborne operations in history, Operation Market Garden was only partially successful.

After heavy fighting, Nijmegen and large parts of North Brabant were liberated, but Arnhem was not. The winter that followed for Arnhem and the Veluwe was a terrible one.

The final push for freedom came in February 1945: Operation Veritable and with it, the start of the great Rhineland Offensive.

The Liberation Route Europe Foundation

Together with over sixty international partners in England, France, Germany and Poland, the Liberation Route Europe Foundation is working on rolling out the route that the allied forces took through Europe in order to put an end to the Second World War.

Its main partners include the British tourist organisation Visit Kent, the Imperial War Musuem, the French Basse-Normandie and the German Rureifel Tourismus.

The 3000-kilometre-long route starts in southern England and goes via Normandy, through Belgium and the south east of Holland on to Berlin.

From the opposite direction, the route runs from Gdansk to Berlin.

The official launch of Liberation Route Europe takes place on the beaches of Normandy on 6 June 2014, exactly seventy years after D-Day.

A travelling exhibition which tells the story of the Liberation Route Europe will travel across Europe.
