The trail to the top is only about a mile long, but it's a three-hour commitment due to a section of Class IV climbing that may involve setting up a belay.

A less adventurous option is to the top of the Pico da Tijuca, also inside Tijuca National Park and the Park's highest point.

Ecuador - Quito, Pasochoa Wildlife Refuge Summit Trail

Twenty miles south of Quito, near the town of Sangolqui, is the access point for a seven-hour roundtrip trek with an elevation gain of 3,000 feet to the summit at 13,800 feet.

The trail is straightforward, but it requires a good level of fitness and, for those who want to get all the way to the top, there is some rock scrambling at the end to reach the summit.

Views along the way include the Avenue of Volcanoes, the snow-clad volcanic peaks of the Andes.

Hikers reach the edge of an ancient, extinct volcanic caldera, with cloud forest-covered crater walls and unique flora such as a rare polylepis forest and many bromeliads. This is one of the best places in Ecuador to see condors in the wild.

This day hike passes right along the side of glacier-clad Osorno Volcano, with incredible views out to magnificent Todos los Santos Lake and the surrounding mountains in the other direction.
